Public Domain News

Apparently the item about the PcW16 Rescue Disc in the last *Newsletter* was not as clear as it could have been, seemingly suggesting that the latest PcW 16 Rescue Disc was now at version 1.36.

To clarify: The Club has three different discs in the PD Library which have specific functions on various machines.

- The latest version of the PcW 16 Rescue Disc is 1.13. This disc is for use only on the PcW 16 and will reload all the built-in programs if your PcW 16 crashes spectacularly. It will not rescue any data that you have written and saved in the cabinet. You are strongly recommended to save any and all of your work on a PcW 16 data disc (not the Rescue Disc).
- The CP/M Emulator for the PcW 16 disc is for use only on the 16. It allows the you to run most CP/M software that you own for the PCW 8000, 9000 or 10 series on a PcW 16. The latest version number is 1.01. The CP/M software must be on a 3½" CF2DD disc. It will not run any of the LocoScript programs, nor will it run any CP/M programs where screen graphics are involved. I know for a fact that the Club's Crossword Maker can not be run on the 16 this way. Sorry. Strangely enough though, Printmaster does work but not MD2 or 3.
- The Joyce CP/M Emulator runs only on a PC (not a PCW or a 16). The PC must be at least a 486. The latest version of the Joyce Emulator is 1.36 and it is very stable indeed. (Early versions tended to hiccup if you did something unusual!) Not only does it run 99% of all CP/M programs including MicroDesign3 (!) but also LocoScript. This means that when your PCW finally dies you can transfer your work onto a PC and continue there. → p.3

You must have your PCW Start of Day discs (from which you load the programs to be used on the PC) already prepared for the set-up and printer you intend to use with the PC, and all your data discs too, on CF2DD 3½" format discs. You will find it much more beneficial if you start to use the Emulator before your PCW fails so that you can make adjustments to your Start-of-Day discs (which must be made on a PCW with a 3½" drive) as and when required.

The limitations are that it can not reproduce the PcW 16 (which has its own unique operating system, not CP/M); it can not work with the 9512 daisywheel printer (you will have to make a Start of Day disc for a new printer which could be a different make of daisy wheel); and LocoScript will only work with printers where the printer drivers are available on the LocoScript Printer Support discs. (If the printer can't be installed for LocoScript on a PCW then it won't work with Loco 3 or 4 running under the Emulator on a PC, even though that printer works perfectly well under Windows.)

In practice, because it is an emulator and has to translate every CP/M command to the equivalent DOS command, it runs a lot slower than Windows. The faster your PC, the faster the Emulator runs. I reckon that you need at least a 250 mHz PC for it to run any faster than a PCW would and, say, 500 mHz to match a PCW with a Sprinter. Even so it lets you continue to use MD3 on your PC.

Fortunately the Emulator allows you to use as much of the memory of the PC that CP/M can support, namely 2Mb, so it is the same as having a 1.5Mb Rampac on the back of a 9512. This means that you can run The Network with MD3 and FSD and Tweak, etc., quite comfortably.
