


#### Chairman's Chatterings

The August meeting was a Brains Trust with questions relating to the PCW being raised by the club members present and members of the panel attempting to provide an on the spot solution. Although we had asked if other members would send in their problems in advance none were received. However one, in particular, which would seem to be of interest to our many LocoScript users is worth repeating.

The query was how could one produce a printed list of the files on a LocoScript disc. The immediate response was to simply press [Extra] and [PTR] together to get a screen dump of the files listed on the Disc Manager screen to the printer. However, this will only work with the 8000 series machines with the dot matrix printer; the query came from a 9512 user.

The answer is to use CP/M which is not as difficult as you may at first imagine and is well worth trying if you have a large number of documents stored on your LocoScript data discs. As some of our members use PCWs fitted with only one drive the following instructions assume no B: drive is available. Load up CP/M by putting your CP/M start of day disc in the A: drive and pressing [Shift] + [Extra] + [Exit] all together.

Remove the CP/M disc, insert the LocoScript data disc and press [Stop] (which has the same effect as f7 in LocoScript). If you now type DIR and press [Enter] you will get a simple five column list of the files on the data disc, not in any particular order and, possibly, with the message 'System Files Exist' at the end. Not very helpful, especially as this is a list of the files in user group 0



only and not the whole disc. The System Files message means that there are some hidden files present too. Surely we can do better than this?

Of course we can, by using DIR.COM. Let's copy DIR.COM to the M: drive and, while we are at it, another useful utility which will be explained later. Remove the data disc and replace the CP/M disc: press [Stop], type PIP and press [Enter]. From now on PIP (or DIR, etc) followed by [Enter] will be termed "Enter PIP (or DIR, etc)". Up will come the message "CP/M 3 PIP Version 3.0" with an asterisk \* on the following line. PIP.COM is waiting for your instructions.

Enter the following: M:=A:DIR.COM, the screen will blink and the asterisk will reappear. DIR.COM has been copied to the M: drive. Now enter M:=PUT.COM and PUT.COM will be copied to M:. (The colon after the M is essential and there should be no spaces between the characters.) Having finished copying simply press [Enter] when the asterisk reappears and you'll be back to the A' prompt. Enter M: and the M' prompt will appear instead.

You are now operating from the M: drive on discs in the A: drive, using the DIR.COM utility. As a test (with your CP/M disc still in place) enter DIR A:. The disc will whirr and a list of files on your CP/M disc will appear on your screen. Replace the CP/M disc with the first of your LocoScript data discs and we'll experiment. (Press [Stop] each time you change your LocoScript discs as you would f7.)

Enter **DIR** A: and you get a simple five column listing of the files on the A: disc. But

enter **DIR A:**[FULL] instead and you get a far more informative list: For a start it's in alphabetical order and you get a summary of the disc at the end and all the hidden files are listed too, with a **Sys** instead of a **Dir** under the Attributes column. However, this is only a list of the files in user group 0 and, especially in LocoScript, we want a list of all the files in all the user groups.

So instead of [Full] try entering the following: DIR A:[User=All] The result will be an alphabetical list of all files in all the groups on the A: disc which are in use. It's getting better but that annoying "Press RETURN to continue" spoils the list so try this instead: DIR A:[User=all NoPage] with

'Nopage' as one word. Now

For a simple printed list make sure the printer is ready and loaded. Press

[Alt] + P (the machine will beep) and touch the [COPY] key; your DIR A:

[User=All NoPage] will

that's a lot better isn't it?

reappear. Press [Enter] and the listing will be sent to both the screen and the printer. Press [Alt]+[P] again (NO beep the second time) and the printer is turned off again. (You may have to load a second sheet of paper midway for lengthy listings.)

However, if you would like this list on the data disc as a LocoScript file try the following: Enter PUT CON OUT TO FILE A: FILELIST.ASC (from the M: prompt which should still be present). (This will send the listing to a file called FileList.Asc on the data disc.) Now enter DIR A:[User=All NoPage] and, provided that the disc is not write protected, the file list will be added to the disc as an Ascii file. Enter PUT CON OUT TO

CON again to finish writing to the disc. Repeat the above three commands for each disc and, when done, Load LocoScript again.

Put the first data disc in the drive and press f7. There should be a new file in user group 0 named FileList.Asc, a copy of the file list that you saw on screen. You can't edit that but you can turn it into a LocoScript document as follows. Create a new file in 0, press f1, Insert text and select the FileList.Asc document; press Enter. The list will flow into the new file but as two columns. Put the spaces codes on with f8, Spaces, [+] and you will note that there are seven spaces between the two columns. Select [Exch] and replace seven spaces with a Return. You can use

Manual if you wish but Automatic will be a lot quick

> though you may need to clean up the odd line which did contain a pair of seven spaces.

Clean up the top heading by deleting the extra 'Name, Bytes, Recs, Attributes'

(and the hyphens) and put a few Returns in the bottom text to make it into a single column. Now save this as FileList.LS and you have a list of all the files in all user groups on that disc in alphabetical order with the file sizes and a summary of the disc at the end. Remember that files listed in the user groups 8-15 are earlier versions of those in 0-7 (what LocoScript calls Limbo) and that this bottom half of the list (except the summary) can safely be deleted with [CUT]. Now print this out in a fixed pitch font, NOT proportionally spaced and put the printed sheet in an A4 ring binder with the disc and file list each in its own pocket wallet.
