Announcements at the February Meeting

This was followed by a special General Meeting of the club to explain the position following the resignation of David Lalieu as Secretary.

Bob Woodford

Bob Woodford, who died on Sunday 30th January 2000, will be remembered by many of us as a keen and enthusiastic member of the club. A regular attendee, always accompanied by his dear wife Vera, he very strongly influenced the development of a friendly camaraderie among members.
