Forthcoming Meetings

The next few Club meetings are planned as follows:

Thursday 11th May:

Part Two of the introduction to CP/M for beginners. This will introduce the utilities which come free with CP/M and how you can use them to supplement the simple filing facilities that are available from the LocoScript Disc Management screen. Please note that this meeting is on the second Thursday in the month for May only

Thursday 1st June:

Introduction to BASIC: Part One.

Thursday 6th July:

Introduction to BASIC: Part Two.

BASIC is the programming language which comes free with your PCW on the CP/M side of your master discs. It can be used to run many hundreds of programs on your PCW including games, spreadsheets, databases, simple word processors and lots of others.

Many of these BASIC programs are available from the Club's Public Domain Library. Details of these and other programs in the PD Library can be had from Daniel French, 44 Charcot House, Highcliffe Drive, Roehampton, London SW15 4PT. Please send a stamped self addressed C5 envelope (i.e. big enough to take folded A4 sheets) for a catalogue.

These meetings are held in the Basildon Centre, St. Martins Square, Basildon, Essex from 7.30 pm to about 10.30 pm in Committee Room 4. The Basildon Centre is very close to Basildon Station on the London, Tilbury & Southend railway line, and only a short distance from the main Bus Station. There is secure parking in the underground car park beneath, accessed from Broadmayne/Great Oaks. (Follow the Council Offices signs.) Attendance is *free* for your first meeting.

Future meetings include workshops on MicroDesign 2 & 3, Databases including LocoFile and Spreadsheets. Remember that the Annual General Meeting is to be held on Thursday 7th September and there will be a club meeting straight afterwards.

If there is a PCW topic or program that you would like explained or discussed at a club night please let one of the Committee members know and it could be arranged for a meeting that you are able to attend.

News for PcW16 Users

An upgrade of the PcW16 Rescue Disc, version 1.13 is now available exclusively from the Club's PD Library. Send a PcW16 formatted HD disc to Daniel with a cheque or postal order for one pound made out to The British Amstrad PCW Club (or five second class stamps will do) for your copy.

Three Inch Software on the move

Three Inch Software, one of the best known suppliers of software for the PCW, has moved from Milton Keynes to rural Aberdeen. Still available for the classic PCWs are the Three Inch Thesaurus, a Rhyming Dictionary, the Copy program and, for those with the PCW9512, the PCW 9512 Rescue Kit.

For obvious reasons the Three Inch Thesaurus is now available on 3½" discs as well. This is a LocoFile datafile of over 14,000 words organised into 1000 word lists in a similar fashion to the standard printed Roget's Thesaurus crammed onto a 720k disc. Used in conjunction with LocoFile and a 720k drive this allows you to find an alternative word to the one you've used in the current document just too many times. The method of cross-linking the words is brilliant and I have no hesitation in recommending this to anyone who cares about their written output. It's as easy to use as LocoSpell.

The Rhyming Dictionary is also a Loco-File data file used, this time, with a Loco-Mail routine provided on the disc. I think it's fairly obvious what this is intended for.

The Copy program is two programs in one. With a very simple menu it enables you to copy either individual files or whole groups of files from one disc or group to another disc or group much more easily than that provided by the LocoScript Disc Management screen. Once you've used this you'll never use F3, Copy, cursor, cursor, etc., ever again. It is also a disc formatting program with a difference. With Copy you can format a PCW9512 boot disc in the B: drive of an 8512. More importantly it

allows you to format or copy slightly damaged discs by a method which marks the bad blocks as damaged but allows you to use the rest of the disc for storage. Try doing that with the unforgiving DiscKit or f4, Discs in LocoScript. This could be the only way of rescuing that essential file from the disc that LocoScript won't read.

The PCW9512 Rescue Kit is a musthave for anyone with a 9512. It allows you to create and copy discs intended for the A: drive of an 8256. Now you can transfer files from the 9512 to 8256 discs without having an 8256 of your own. Again this may be just what you need to rescue those files and get them printed out by a friend when your daisy-wheel has just died!

Three Inch Software sell reformatted, used-once, 720k 3" discs (from Amstrad CPC machines) for £3 each and brand new unused Japanese 3" discs at £5 each; this may be just what you need too.

The Thesaurus retails at £14.95, the Rhyming Dictionary at £19.95 whilst Copy is £9.95 as is the PCW9512 Rescue Kit. All these prices include UK postage. Contact Alan Giles, Three Inch Software, Rowan Cottage, Wester Craigie, Whitecairns, Aberdeen AB23 8XE for further details. Phone 01651 862359.

Congratulations and thanks to Alan for helping to keep the world of PCW software alive. Alan was also one of the brains behind MicroDraw and MicroChart, both of which ran within The Network. I've not seen these advertised for some time now but he may be able to tell you where to buy these two excellent drawing programs too.

The bad news is that PCW programmer and software retailer PD Blake finds MS Windows a much more attractive prospect and has pulled out of the PCW market.

Crossword Maker bargain for Club members only

The Crossword Maker program which runs on all PCWs with a 3½" drive is now available to Club members at the special price of £9.95 only. This is because we have been able to make cost savings with bulk disc copying and manual printing.

The package contains three different programs, each with its own instruction manual. The main disc is the Crossword Maker itself. This enables you to compose crossword puzzles up to 28 letters square. These can be printed out in MicroDesign 2 or MD3 or in LocoScript. You do not have to own MicroDesign to print your results but it does help. A number of word list files are provided as the "dictionary" from which your words are selected.

The accompanying Word File Manager program which is included in the pack enables you to create word lists of your own, for example, lists of medical or religious or financial words, to produce crosswords for a particular audience.

Also included is a Word Search Maker program which lets you create word search puzzles up to 20 letters square; these last two run under BASIC.
