Annual General Meeting

The September meeting of the Club is the Annual General Meeting, to be held at 7.30 pm on Thursday 7th in Committee Room 4 of the Basildon Centre, St Martins Square, Basildon. All members of the Club are invited to attend free of charge.

As you will see from the Committee list Steve Massam is currently both *Disc Drive* editor and Membership Secretary. He has given notice that he must relinquish one of these posts before too long. We therefore need a volunteer and the AGM would be a sensible time to hand over one of the jobs.

Unlike most of the Committee members who are retired, Steve is self employed and his work must come first. This is the reason why the Summer edition of the *Disc Drive* has been delayed for which we apologise.

We mailed out the green Notice of the AGM with its enquiry form in lieu of a Newsletter so that we could assess how many were likely to renew their subs and, therefore, estimate the print run for the Disc Drive and the Newsletter for the coming year. As you can imagine, the costs of printing these two publications are based on the number required. Fortunately, there were sufficient replies for us to keep the subscriptions at the same level as last year, £12 per head.

At least the British Amstrad PCW Club is still in being, not having succumbed totally to the ubiquitous PC. From the various newsletters we receive it would appear that this is the only PCW club left still dealing just with the PCW. The Crawley and Radstock meetings seem to concentrate almost exclusively on the PC and the Widmore Club appears to have had its last meeting. Even ScotWest.pcw now admits to discussion of Windows!

Future Meetings

The meeting on the 5th of October is to be on databases and LocoFile. Recent meetings have consisted of one person operating a PCW and other members just watching on dumb monitors. Whilst this means that everyone sees the same screen keystrokes they do no get the hands-on interactivity of earlier meetings. In an attempt to overcome this members are invited to bring their own machine to the meetings to use alongside the monitors. This does mean that you will have to have your own copy of the program being demonstrated but at least you can try your hand at it and watch the tutor's keystrokes on the monitor at the same time.

Many people have LocoFile so bring it along with your PCW (but it must be later than version 2.5). There will be no need to bring a printer.

The meeting on 2nd of November is on Spreadsheets and in particular SuperCalc 2 although other spreadsheet programs will be discussed. Again, bring along your PCW with a copy of the spreadsheet program you use and we can compare the advantagers and disadvantages of the various packages. There will not be room for PCWs and the monitors and printers so please leave your printer at home or in the car.

The December meeting is intended to be Competition night with a small prize for the best items produced exclusively on a PCW. There will not be a tutorial as such so there is no need to bring your machine. However, please do bring along samples of work done on the PCW during the year. Postal members are not excluded: send your items to Mike Elliston to arrive before the end of November.
